Radiological Accident Response Training for Emergency Responders

The Lake Jericho Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department is hosting for the Kentucky Radiation Health Branch and the United States Department of Energy (DOE) through its Transportation Emergency Preparedness Program (TEPP) a Compressed Modular Emergency Response Radiological Transportation Training (CMERRTT) session on January 20, 2018. The 8-hour training program will be offered at the Lake Jericho Fire Station (Headquarters) located at 531 Lake Jericho Road. The training will be offered from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM. Participants are required to attend all eight-hours of training to receive full credit for the training.

The CMERRTT Program takes the complex topic of a radiological response and break it down into easily understood modules. Students will develop an understanding of radiological basics, radiological survey instruments, decontamination techniques, process for handling radiologically contaminated victims, and resources available to you during your response. The course includes several hours of hands-on activities including the use of radiation detection equipment, identifying the various types of radioactive material packaging, and the use of "live" radiation sources to reinforce learning. Upon successful completion of CMERRTT, each student will receive a certificate from the Department of Energy's Transportation Emergency Preparedness Program, including 6 continuing education hours (CEH) credit.
